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## WELCOME from your Scout Executive

In 2016, over 30,000 youth, nation-wide participated in the Lion program. One of the most interesting statistics in the first year of the program is that 72% of participant's families were new to Scouting; welcoming many new faces to the Boy Scouts of America.

Sometime during the month of May, those who participated in the 2016 Lions program will be receiving a survey asking for their opinions and thoughts of the program. The council hopes to encourage more packs to take part in the pilot in 2017. It is expected that the program will move out of the "pilot" stage in 2018, becoming a permanent part of Cub Scouting.

As we move deeper into our 100th Anniversary year, we are coming up to our Annual Camporall. Alena Toberman's team is once again planning a great event. Many Scouts may never attend a National Jamboree or take part in a High Adventure Trip. For many, events like this will be the largest Scouting activity they will attend. ### **5. Making a Kite (DuTrac)**




