Scouting for Food – March 25

This project is one of pride for Scouting in the community! The NEIC has been participating in this service project since 1990. Our food pantries are depending on us, as this drive alone supplies them with food for over three months!

Dellaykee District Merit Badge University – March 25

This is your chance to earn another merit badge. Options include Weather, Citizenship in the Nation or Community, Communications, or Engineering.

Troop 86 Pancake Breakfast Fundraiser – March 26

The breakfast takes place at Horizon Hall in Bellevue, Iowa. The breakfast is all you can eat, so come hungry! Pancakes, eggs, and ham and rolls are included!

Wilderness First Aid and CPR Course – April 1

Wilderness First Aid (WFA) is the assessment of and treatment given to an ill or injured person in a remote environment where definitive care by a physician and/or rapid transport is not readily available. Participants will learn how to assess, treat, and (when possible) contain emergencies within the scope of their training.

2017 College of Commissioner Science – April 1

Courses include Basic Commissioner Training, Bachelors in Commissioner Science, Masters in Commissioner Science, PhD in Commissioner Science, Unit Lifesaving Certification, Cub Scout & Boy Scout Roundtable curriculum, and general commissioner development courses.

High Adventure Scholarship Application Due – April 1

The Floor Show Furniture and Flooring of Dubuque will grant two youth scholarships of \$250 each to two youth each year for a total of \$500 to help offset fees for the High Adventure experience. This can be used for Philmont, Northern Tier, Sea Base, Jamboree, or other High Adventures.

Dubuque District Pinewood Derby – April 8

Compete with other District Cub Scouts for bragging rights as well as awards. Trophies will be awarded to the fastest cars in each rank division. Judge's awards will be awarded in the following categories: Most Unique, Most Patriotic, and Most Scout-like.

Dellaykee District Pinewood Derby – April 22

All Cub Scouts and their families are invited to attend! 1st Place, 2nd Place, & 3rd Place trophies will be awarded for each rank division.

Cub Scout Camp

Cub Scout Camps are now open for registration! Camps are designed to give your Cub Scout a great Scouting experience full of the activities they WANT to take part in!

Cub Scout Day Camps are single-day adventures held 2 times this summer at different locations. This year's day camps will be held on June 3rd in Elkader, and August 5th in Dubuque. The Cub Scouts will have both morning and afternoon activities to stay busy the entire day!

Camp Klaus Overnight Camp is a two-day adventure that includes one overnight camping experience for Scouts and their parent(s) or guardians. There are two sessions available for Scouts: June 17-18 or July 22-23. Meals, lodging and activities are all included in the registration fee.

Webelos Weekend is a three-day, two-night camping experience for Webelos only! The Scouts will work on Webelos Activity Pins in an open program schedule – they choose what they want to do! This year's Webelos Weekend takes place July 7th – 9th.

OKPIK 2017

For the first time in 3 years – NEIC has an OKPIK slot! In fact – we have two! Time is very short to determine if we take any crews at all (minimum age is at least 8th grade at time of trek).

Departure is December 27 with return likely on January 1. The drive is 440 miles – first and last night are in cabins – with the in between nights out camping on a frozen lake and sleeping under the clearest sky you'll ever see. Activities include cross country skiing, snowshoeing, igloo building, trekking, a short dog sled ride, and learning winter survival techniques.

The cost for a crew is fixed – so filling the crew will lower the per person cost – estimated at \$475 to \$630 per person (plus the share of transportation costs to/from Northern Tier). This is an outstanding experience at the lowest possible cost for a BSA High Adventure – at a time where scouts are likely experiencing holiday down time – perfect timing for an epic adventure!

High Adventure Scholarship

Silver Beaver Award Winners

The Northeast Iowa Council was proud to award three Silver Beaver awards at the Annual Meeting and Appreciation Dinner held on March 4th, 2017. This year's winners included Larry Geisler, Tammy DeWulf, and Aaron Seier. Below is a little more about each winner. Thank you all for your faithful service to your community and to Scouting!



Larry Geisler: Larry has served the youth of the Northeast Iowa Council for almost 30 years. Like many volunteers, his service began with the purpose of ensuring that his children had the opportunities in academics, religion, and Scouting that he believed in. Larry has served as a Den Leader, Cubmaster and Committee Chairman for the only Cub Scout Pack in his community. Larry's efforts for popcorn distribution in the Del-laykee district are especially appreciated as a "come-to-one-location-to-pick-up-your-orders" plan is not practical. He was one of the first Pack leaders to computerize the sales and pack records, then assisted other in doing the same.

Outside of Scouting Larry served over 30 years on the high school Booster Club, in addition to being a coach and coordinator for youth wrestling. He spent several years as a committee member of the Whole Grade Sharing Committee for the MFL and Mar-MAC school. He also served for 4 years on the Band Booster Club and helped with fundraising efforts for new band uniforms.



Tammy DeWulf: Tammy's service to youth began in 2002 when her sons became Tiger Cubs. Since that time she served as a Tiger Cub Coach, Den Leader, Webelos Leader and Assistant Cubmaster. When her sons, who would later become Eagle Scouts, joined Boy Scouts, Tammy signed up to serve as an Assistant Scoutmaster, a position she held for 11 years. On the district level she has served as a unit commissioner, assistant district commissioner and a member of the district committee.

Tammy is a member of the Timmeu Lodge, a regular helper at the Mother's Day Pancake Breakfast and can be seen working in the kitchen at the spring and fall work weekends. She was selected in 2015 to receive the Vigil Honor recognition. Outside of Scouting Tammy has served as a Junior Achievement adviser for 4 years, served the American Heart Association and worked with youth groups and festivals at Resurrection Parish.



Aaron Seier: Aaron began his Scouting career in 1984 as a Cub Scout in Pack 65. His interest and involvement continued to grow and he later earned his Eagle Scout rank. As a youth he twice served on Camp Klaus staff and served on the Junior Leader Training staff multiple times. In 1997 he served on the OA Service Corps at the national Scout Jamboree. For 6 years he served as Lodge Adviser for the Timmeu lodge and attended NOAC 6 times as either an adult adviser or a NOAC staff member. In addition, Aaron was a past president and adviser to the Beta Epsilon Chapter of the Alpha Phi Omega.

Aaron was one of the adult volunteers who assisted in the construction of the climbing and rappelling tower at Camp Klaus. He joined the Executive Board in 2007 and currently serves as the VP of Properties. He considers Camp Klaus as his second home, and he spends many weekends working on maintenance projects for camp. In 2013, he helped begin the Camp Klaus Golf Outing to help supplement the Council's property budget; he is still involved in this important fund-raising project for camp.

Philmont 2018

The Council is once again sponsoring a trip to Philmont in 2018. Departure is June 21 and return is July 6. Cost is \$1,475 per person (minimum age 14 or have completed 8th grade). Please note – if you want to be a part of this pinnacle of the Scouting High Adventure experience – then a non-refundable deposit of \$100 must be made with the Scout office by April 15.

We have three crews reserved – but we'll only keep as many crews as we have spots filled. We'll also fill spots based upon those who put their deposits down first. So don't delay! Memorial Tribute Fund

Words too often do not express the sentiment we feel at the death of a friend. No finer tribute can be paid than to encourage some boy to live the life of a Scout, and thus perpetuate the high principles you admire in your friend.
