When asked what advice she would give other leaders, her quote was simply “Don’t over think it. They are just kids who want to learn what Scouting has to teach”.

What great advice! I would be naïve to think there will not be any bumps in the road, but putting it all in perspective will be helpful as we move into this new chapter in Scouting.



# VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

## Silver Beaver Award Recipient

The Northeast Iowa Council was proud to award three Silver Beaver awards at the Annual Meeting and Appreciation Dinner held on March 10th, 2018. This year's recipient's included Mike Puetz, Curtis DeWulf, and Dave Wagner. Below is a little more about each recipient. Thank you all for your faithful service to your community and to Scouting!



### Mike Puetz

How many units can one individual give attention to? There seems to be no limit, based on the contributions of Mike Puetz. He has served as a Cubmaster, a Scoutmaster, a Venture Crew adviser, Timmeu Lodge committee adviser, and a contingent leader for the National Order of the Arrow Conference. Mike recognized long ago that being trained was important to his success in delivering a quality program to youth. He completed the C-05-05 Woodbadge training and later served on Woodbadge staff in the most recent course hosted by the Council.

In spite of his unit-level service, Mike still finds time to assist with numerous activities to help maintain and improve Camp Klaus. This has included brush and tree removal after storms, weekday preparations preceding the OA Section conclave, and assisting with the golf outing to help raise funds for Camp Klaus.

In addition to his Scouting activities, Mike has made numerous contributions to the Friends of the Future Farmers of America. This organization even acknowledged his contributions by bestowing the Friends of the West Dubuque FFA Honorary Chapter Member recognition. He currently serves as treasurer of the Tri County Sportsman Club.



### Curtis DeWulf:

Curtis DeWulf began his 40-year involvement in the Northeast Iowa Council in 1976 as a Cub Scout in Pack 7, and later Pack 91. As a youth or an adult, his Scouting involvement has been extensive, consistent, and visible for more than 40 years in the Northeast Iowa Council. He is perhaps best known for faithfully demonstrating to everyone the 12th point of the Scout Law. All Boy Scouts know that the 12th point of the Scout Law is that A Scout is Reverent. Curtis is the only person in the Council to have earned or been presented, as either a youth or an adult, every award that the Catholic Committee on Scouting can bestow.

Curtis has served on the District Committee, Woodbadge staff, summer camp staff, a committee adviser to the Order of the Arrow, NYLT adult adviser, and continues to work in the kitchen for numerous Scouting events. He also revived the local Catholic Committee on Scouting.

He is an active member of his church, and supplements this activity with his involvement in the Knights of Columbus Council. He became a 4th Degree Knight in 2004, and a Recorder in 2005.



### Dave Wagner:

Dave Wagner's Scouting journey in the Northeast Iowa Council began in the early 1960's. He earned his Eagle Scout rank in 1965. About a decade later, he served as an Assistant Scoutmaster and later as Scoutmaster for Troop 67. Since 2006, Dave has served as an active member of the Council Executive Board. His leadership includes serving as a committee chairman for 8 years. The lake dredging project was completed during one of his two terms as Council President. His leadership always models the Scout Oath and Scout Law.

Noteworthy community service include multiple leadership positions in the Jaycees organization: President, Dubuque Jaycees in 1978; District Director of the Iowa Jaycees in 1979; Director of the Regional Jaycees in 1980, and VP of the Iowa Jaycees in 1981. Dave also served the America Red Cross for 16 years. He has served 16 years on the Trust Committee, and 6 years as the Chapter Chairman.




