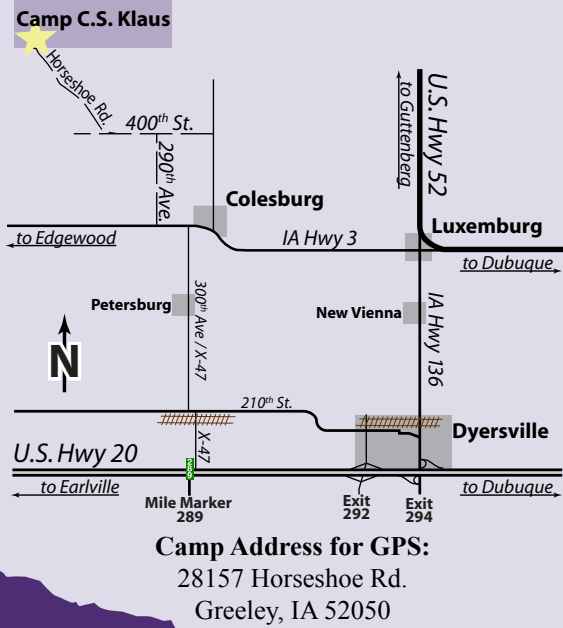

How to get to Camp Klaus

One mile west of Colesburg on Hwy. 3, turn north on 290th Ave (gravel road) and drive 0.9 miles.

Turn left (west) at the stop sign on to 400th St.

Drive about 0.7 miles and stay to the right when the road splits. Follow Horseshoe Road for about 0.7 miles to the Camp Klaus entrance on the right.



CUB SCOUT MAGICAL ADVENTURE DAY CAMPS

Day Camps are magical single-day adventures in Elkader and Dubuque! Each participant will keep busy participating in activities such as magical games, herbology, potions, transfiguration, and much, much, more!

June 22-23 or July 20-21 at Camp C.S. Klaus

These **two-day magical adventures** are one overnight camping experience for Scouts and their parent(s) or guardian(s).
