

## HOW TO GET TO CAMP

One mile west of Colesburg, IA on Hwy. 3, turn north onto 290<sup>th</sup> Ave (gravel road) and drive 0.9 miles.

Turn left (west) at the stop sign onto 400<sup>th</sup> St.



Drive about 0.7 miles and stay to the right when the road splits. Follow Horseshoe Road for about 0.7 miles to the Camp Klaus entrance.

# CAMP C.S. KLAUS

Camp C.S. Klaus is situated in a 200 acre wooded valley, located near Colesburg in the countryside of Northeastern Iowa. The camp is situated in a beautiful wooded valley, 14 acre lake, and scenic waterfall area. With eight camp sites, platform tents, private showers, forty-foot climbing tower, COPE course and the beautiful Munter Lodge Dining Center, Camp Klaus provides a comfortable yet adventurous camping experience.

Whether you're looking to earn merit badges, participate in high adventure-like experiences, or just relax in the outdoors, Camp Klaus has it all. Our program areas include Aquatics, Ecology, Handicraft, Field Sports, BASE Camp, Climbing, Low and High COPE rope course, Scoutcraft, Eagle Quest, Sports and PEAK. Additionally, we offer activities during the afternoon and evening, such as our Ironman Competition, Water-follies, Patrol Games and a twilight activity that will keep you having fun all day.

### Campsites & Shower Facilities

Wooded campsites feature spacious wall tents on wooden platforms with two canvas cots. Located in each campsite are wash stands with running water, camp fire pits with firewood, picnic tables and a latrine. Hot, private showers are available at a centrally located shower house.

### Dining & Meals in the Munter Lodge Dining Center

Meals are served in the modern Munter Lodge Dining Center. Delicious meals always include great food and fellowship. All meals are approved by a dietician and served family style for dinner. Lunch and breakfast is served buffet style. Troops will also prepare three meals during the week in their campsite from sufficient supplies that will be delivered right to the campsite.

### Camp C.S. Klaus Trading Post

The new larger camp trading post is fully stocked with everything you might need while at camp. Merit badge books, craft supplies, souvenirs, a basic assortment of camping gear, camp t-shirts, patches and a wide range of snack items. Stop in for a soda, a candy bar or indulge in a delicious ice cream treat on a hot summer day. The Choco-Taco has been the camp favorite since 1995! (We can accept cash, debit or credit card.)

### Program Materials

Our program areas have everything you will need to have a great time... canoes, sail-boats, row boats, paddleboards, life jackets, bows, arrows, rifles and shotguns, climbing gear, crafts, critters, bugs, reptiles, frisbee golf, gaga pit and whatever else you feel like doing!

### Camp Staff

All of our summer camp programs are staffed with a fantastic and the most "wildly-energetic" group of trained adults, young men and women who conduct each of the program activities. By the time you leave, you will surely have a favorite staff member (or a group of them) that you will remember for years to come!

### Health & Safety

Our health lodge is staffed 24 hours a day by a qualified medical officer. If you need any special medication, please have written directions prepared for check-in. Medication will be dispensed by the medic.
