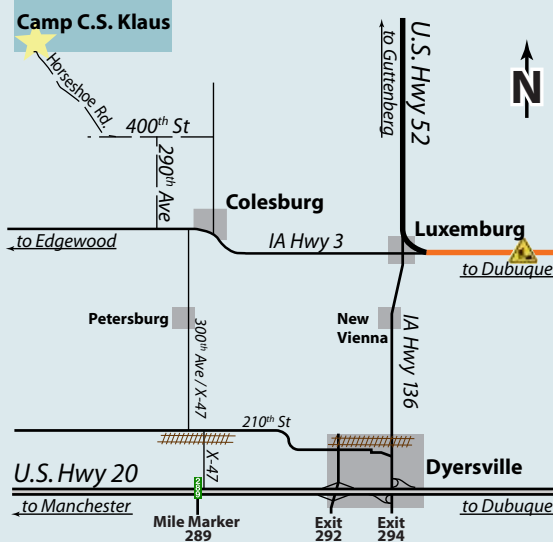

How to get to Camp Klaus

One mile west of Colesburg on Hwy. 3, turn north on 290th Ave (gravel road) and drive 0.9 miles.

Turn left (west) at the stop sign on to 400th St.

Drive about 0.7 miles and stay to the right when the road splits. Follow Horseshoe Road for about 0.7 miles to the Camp Klaus entrance on the right.

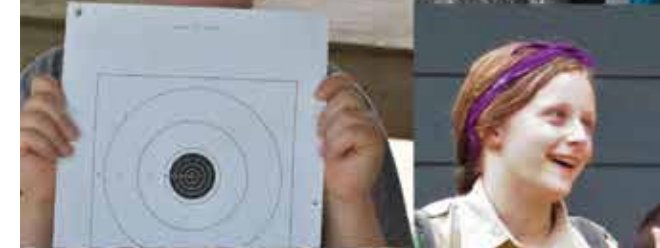

- **A Fantastic Camp Staff**
All of our summer camp program options are staffed with a fantastic and the most “wildly-energetic” group of trained adults, young men and women who conduct each of the program activities.

Our beautiful wooded campsites feature spacious wall tents on wooden platforms with two canvas cots. Located in each campsite are wash stands with running water, camp fire pits with firewood, picnic tables, and a latrine.

A shower house is centrally located near the campsites.

All meals at Camp Klaus are served in the Munter Lodge Dining Center. All meals are included with registration.
- **Lake John Deere**
After an extensive re-excavation in 2014, Lake John Deere’s aquatics area continues to receive rave reviews! Larger than 45 Olympic sized swimming pools and updated facilities. Lake John Deere features a large swim area, docks, a fantastic beach, and great fishing and hiking access all around!
