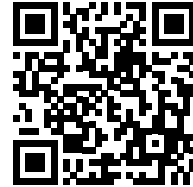

## Cub Scout Day Camps (1 day activity, no overnight camping)

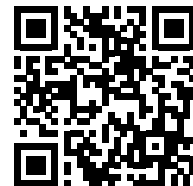
- June 5 - Elkader (Osborne Park)** \$35 per Scout.  
ADULTS FREE
- July 23 - Klaus Kids (Camp C.S. Klaus)** IMPORTANT: Each Pack is required to have a minimum of one adult leader for every four Cub Scouts.
- August 7 - Dubuque (Grandview United Methodist Church)** For Scouts going into Kindergarten or 1st grade, an adult must attend with their Scout.

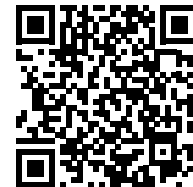
## Cub Scout Overnight Adventures (2 days, 1 night of camping)

- June 26-27 at Camp C.S. Klaus** \$80 per Scout with Adult Partner by April 15
  - July 17-18 at Camp C.S. Klaus** \$90 per Scout with Adult Partner after April 15
- IMPORTANT: Adult partner must attend with their Scout.



## Webelos Mini Camp (3 days, 2 nights of camping)

- July 9-11 at Camp C.S. Klaus** \$110 per Scout by April 15
  - July 19-21 at Camp C.S. Klaus** \$120 per Scout after April 15  
\$45 per Adult Leader
- IMPORTANT: Each Pack is required to have a minimum of one registered adult leader with current Youth Protection Training for every four Cub Scouts.



### Health & Safety Information:

**REQUIRED – BSA Medical Forms must be completed and turned in when you arrive at each event.**

Please note: For all Cub Scout camps, your physical form **DOES NOT** need to be completed by a doctor. Completely fill out the form (Part A & B) with all necessary information.

To participate in a BSA Cub Camp, the Boy Scouts of America Health and Medical Record need to be filled out in full for YOUTH AND ADULTS, and turned in when you arrive at the event. This form will be available via your Cubmaster and available for download from the Northeast Iowa Council website at [www.ScoutsIowa.org](http://www.ScoutsIowa.org).

The health and safety of Scouts, their families, and our staff is of the utmost importance. Council administration is working with a group of dedicated volunteers to review all safety and health concerns, especially in the COVID-19 pandemic. Be sure to follow Camp C.S. 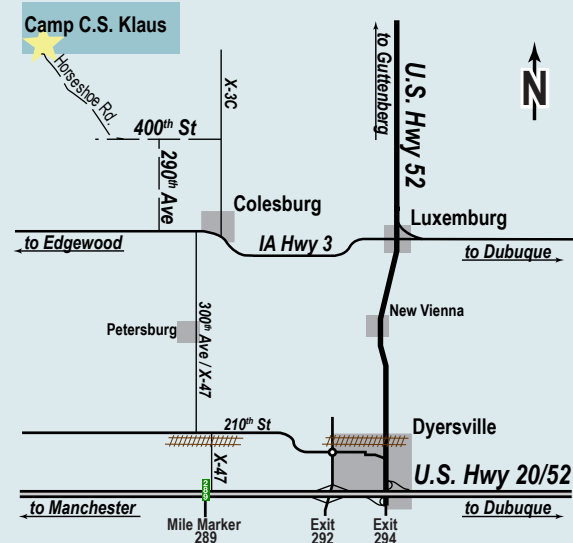

# How to get to Camp C.S. Klaus

One mile west of Colesburg on Hwy. 3, turn north on 290<sup>th</sup> Ave (gravel road) and drive 0.9 miles.

Turn left (west) at the stop sign on to 400<sup>th</sup> St.

Drive about 0.7 miles and stay to the right when the road splits. Follow Horseshoe Road for about 0.7 miles to the Camp Klaus entrance on the right.

**June 26-27 or July 17-18 at Camp C.S. Klaus**

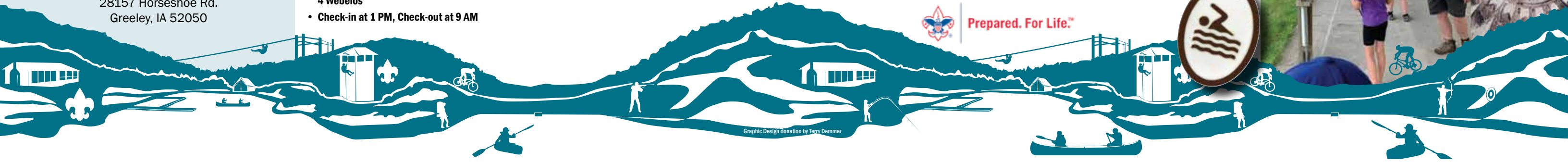
### • Health & Safety
